Chairman's Report

Our Constitution calls upon the Board of Directors to report on the activities of the Company during the last preceding financial year and on behalf of the Board I have pleasure in submitting that report for Members' consideration.

Financial Results

Our 2013/2014 Profit was \$181,564, which is up from \$106,673 in the prior year. This result was a very satisfactory outcome in terms of our budget expectations, and is very pleasing in terms of our planning efforts. It is also pleasing to see an increase in income in a number of areas, and a reduction in expenditure in others. It is not an easy task to maintain profit to budgeted levels given the many variables that effect final results.

Although membership income remained stable, registration, Complex, and Committee & Region income increased. Unfortunately there was again a decrease in advertising income, however with the very competitive advertising rates we now offer, thanks to the new Journal arrangements, it is hoped this decline will be reversed, and the Journal Expenditure figure significantly reduced in the 2014/2015 year.

The Board of Directors and our Finance Committee will continue to examine strategies in an endeavour to supplement our income and reduce our expenditure into the future. The first result of this strategy is our decision to bring the Journal "in house" for the first time in over a decade. The preparation of the magazine will be done solely by our Staff, and we have an Australian printer. The Board looks forward to the significant cost saving this decision will make for the Company.

Once more our total revenue exceeded three million dollars entrenching the organisation as a significant corporation.

I thank both our past and present CEOs for their very great personal contribution to maintenance of the profit level above budget throughout the year, and also thank those who supported our CEOs so strongly, the Board, the Finance Committee and our Staff.

◆Dogs NSW Staff and Committees

The CEO and the staff are the Company's most valuable asset, and they deserve the grateful thanks of the Membership for their efforts over the past year. It has not been an easy year for our Office personnel with the unexpected resignation of our CEO Christine Davis, due to her very serious illness. Christine has been our respected CEO since 2007 and our thoughts and prayers are with her as she continues to battle her illness. Christine has been presented with a Distinguished Service Award for her outstanding contribution to the Company.

Virginia Gagan Wilson and the senior staff shouldered a great deal of extra work over a number of months, and the Board and I are most grateful for their efforts during a difficult time for all of them.

In May Virginia was formally appointed CEO by the Board, we congratulate her, and wish her well in her new role. She is now very ably assisted by her new PA, Anne Reynolds, who we welcomed to the Staff in August.

In this report it is customary to farewell retiring Directors and this year we say farewell and thank you to Vicki Etherington OAM who leaves us after 18 years of service to the membership as a Director. Vicki has been a very active contributor to the debate at Board Meetings and has strongly and conscientiously served the Obedience disciplines as Chairperson of the Obedience & Tracking Committee and the Obedience & Tracking Judges Committee. Thank you Vicki for your wonderful service to the Membership, and in particular to the Obedience disciplines.

Vicki will be succeeded by Maria Wheeler, who will be welcomed to the Board at the conclusion of this meeting. We wish Maria a successful tenure and look forward to her contribution.

♦The Bill Spilstead Complex

Although our lease arrangements over the Complex take us through to 2038, we continue to take any opportunity of getting the message across to the State Government that we are very anxious to discuss a much longer term arrangement, and to this end continue to involve our Politicians in our events and activities.

Health and Welfare

The Board of Directors is very pleased with the very high level of compliance by the Membership to the measures introduced in the last couple of years to address health and welfare issues.

There is clear evidence that these measures have been greatly welcomed by the Government and social commentators interested in animal welfare matters.

The work of our Animal Welfare & Community Liaison Officer has also been crucial to our profile and to ensure compliance by our members. Deirdre has carried out a number of property inspections over the year.

Our new requirements to obtain a Breeders Prefix have also been welcomed. It is no longer possible to simply be entitled to a prefix after passing an Open Book Exam. A term of membership and an inspection of their premises are now essential if a person wishes to become a registered breeder with Dogs NSW.

◆Government & Industry Relations and the Media

We welcomed Ministers Don Page and Katrina Hodgkinson to our Complex during the year to present the Governments response to the recommendations of the Companion Animals Taskforce.

Unfortunately our concerns were not totally allayed in their presentation, however, we were heartened by the Government's decision to establish an Advisory Group to work further on some of the main recommendations which could affect our Members, and also by their invitation to Dogs NSW to be part of that Group. Dr Karen Hedberg, BVSc, one of Dogs NSW Honorary Veterinarians was appointed by the Board as our representative to that Group, and at this time we are still awaiting their first report.

To ensure we maintain the profile developed through the work of the membership for our response to the Companion Animal Taskforce, the Board convened a Media & Government Legislation Committee which is chaired by Brian Crump. This Committee continues to keep a watchful eye for any need to respond to any media attack on our dog world or any proposed legislation which could affect us.

1 STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report covers Royal NSW Canine Council Ltd (ABN 69 062 986 118) as a parent entity, and Kennel Control of NSW Pty Ltd as a wholly owned subsidiary. The Royal NSW Canine Council Ltd is a company limited by guarantee, incorporated and domiciled in Australia.

Basis of Preparation

Royal New South Wales Canine Council Limited applies Australian Accounting Standards - Reduced Disclosure Requirements as set out in AASB 1053: Application of Tiers of Australian Accounting Standards and AASB 2010-2: Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards arsing from Reduced Disclosure Requirements.

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards - Reduced Disclosure Requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board (AASB) and the Corporations Act 2001. The company is a not-for-profit entity for the financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards.

Australian Accounting Standards set out accounting policies that the AASB has concluded would result in a financial report containing relevant and reliable information about transactions, events and conditions to which they apply. Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of this financial report are presented below. They have been consistently applied unless otherwise stated.

The financial statements, expect for the cash flow information, have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities. The amount presented in the financial statements have been rounded to the nearest dollar.

Accounting Policies

(a) Principles of consolidation

A controlled entity is any entity the Royal NSW Canine Council Ltd has the power to control the financial and operating policies of an entity so as to obtain benefits from its activities. Details of the controlled entity are contained in Note 20.

All inter-company balances and transactions between entities in the economic entity, including any unrealised profits or losses, have been eliminated on consolidation.

(b) Revenue

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to the customer.

Donations and bequests are recognised as revenue when received unless they are designated for a specific purpose, where they are carried forward as prepaid income on the balance sheet.

Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets.

Revenue from the rendering of service is recognised upon delivery of the service to the customer.

Revenue from memberships & registrations are recognised when received.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of Goods and Services Tax (GST).

(d) Collectibles

Collectibles which include artwork owned by the company is carried at valuation. The independent valuation was performed by Malcolm Boyd of Artvest Australia on 22 October 2008.

(c) Inventories

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and current replacement cost.

(e) Property, plant & equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value, less where applicable, any accumulated depreciation or amortisation and impairment loss.

Plant and equipment and leasehold improvements

Plant and equipment and leasehold improvements are measured on the cost basis less depreciation and impairment losses.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment and leasehold improvements are reviewed annually by the Directors to ensure that they are not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives to the entity commencing from the time that the asset is held ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

Class of Asset

Leasehold Improvements 2.5% - 20% Plant & Equipment 10% - 40%

(f) Leases

Leases of fixed assets, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset but not the legal ownership, are transferred to the economic entity are classified as finance leases. Finance leases are capitalised, recording an asset and a liability equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Leased assets are depreciated on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives where it is likely that the economic entity will obtain ownership of the asset, or over the term of the lease. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for the period.

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

(g) Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the entity is non assessable for tax under the provisions of the Income Tax Assessment Act.

(h) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the entity's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits expected to be settled within one year together with entitlements arising from wages and salaries, annual leave and sick leave which will be settled after one year, have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related on-costs. Other employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the net present value.

Contributions are made by the economic entity to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

1 STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

(i) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. On these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of expense. Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of the GST.

(i) Cash

For the purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash includes

- Cash on hand and at call deposits with banks or financial institutions, net of bank overdrafts
- Investments in money market instruments with less than 14 days to maturity.

(k) Intangibles - Software

Software is recorded at cost. Software has a finite life and is carried at cost less any accumulated amortisation and impairment losses.

(I) Impairment

At each reporting date, the group reviews the carrying values of its intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expenses to the income statement. Value in use is calculated is depreciated replacement cost of an asset.

(m) Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgements

The Directors evaluate estimates and judgements incorporated into the financial statements based on historical knowledge and best available current information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the company.

Kennel Control of NSW Pty Ltd entered into an agreement on 24 November 1990 to lease a property (being the site of The Bill Spilstead Complex for Canine Affairs) at Orchard Hills NSW from the NSW Government (Minister Administering the *Environment and Planning Act, 1979*) for a period of 17 years and 6 months commencing on 24 November 1990 with a further 20 year option to renew. The original lease finished on 23 May 2008 and the company has extended the lease by exercising the option. The rent is 50% of the current market rent. The current market rental has been determined as \$90,000. The Current market rent is to be reviewed by the Minister for Administering the Environmental *Planning & Assessment Act 1979* every three years.
