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### **Chairman's Report**

In accordance with our Articles, the Board of Directors is required to report on the activities of the Company during the preceding financial year. On behalf of the Board, I am pleased to present the 2023/2024 Report for your review and consideration.

I have had the privilege of serving on the Board of DOGS NSW since 2016 and, for the past seven years, I have been part of the Executive Committee. I was first elected President in November 2021, serving until April 2023, and was re-elected to the position in November 2023.

The years from 2021 to 2024 have presented numerous challenges. Among the most significant were the ongoing threats posed by Government legislation, which cast a shadow over much of the optimism within the dog community. In addition, unprecedented weather conditions disrupted our grounds and the COVID-19 pandemic severely limited our ability to engage in regular weekly activities, which are central to the social and recreational lives of our members and their dogs.

Looking ahead, key areas that must be addressed for the continued success of DOGS NSW include:-

- Membership growth and retention: It is crucial to sustain and increase our membership base.
- **Strategic planning**: We must develop a long-term strategy that considers our location and embraces opportunities for innovation to ensure a positive future for the organisation.

Currently, I serve as the Chair of the Media & Government Legislation Committee. Along with the Committee members, I am actively engaging with prominent members of the NSW Parliament to emphasise that DOGS NSW is the leading authority for responsible dog breeders in New South Wales.

Despite the challenges, our organisation has achieved positive financial results, concluding the 2023/2024 financial year with a strong performance. The operational management of DOGS NSW has resulted in a substantial financial surplus, thanks to the dedicated efforts of the Finance Committee, particularly the Chairman, Ross Sinclair, Operations Manager, Anthony Khamis, and Financial Accountant, Kenny Liu.

Our Office is recognised as one of the most efficient in Australia, particularly in terms of processing registrations, transfers and other administrative tasks. The staff, who handle the wide range of responsibilities within the organisation, deserve full credit for this achievement.

I would also like to extend special recognition to our Company Secretary, Virginia Gagan-Wilson, who manages a wide array of tasks, from member complaints and Committee communications to preparing the extensive monthly Board meeting agenda.

Finally, I would like to express my deep gratitude to the members of the Board, who volunteer their time and expertise for the betterment of our organisation.

Our major event, Dogs On Show was a huge success with numerous activities, demonstrations and vendors showcased to the general public.

The Christmas Party Show provided an opportunity to see grandparents and children of our exhibitors celebrating and enjoying the festive season.

At this year's Advance<sup>TM</sup> Sydney Royal Dog Show we negotiated a larger area to showcase our various dog sports which was enthusiastically received by the general public eager to learn about sporting activities in their local dog community.

2024 saw the inception of a new DOGS NSW Events Committee to focus on our 2 main events allowing the current Public Relations Committee to focus on events specifically directed at the public to encourage engagement and participation in our numerous and varied dog activities.

DOGS NSW Public Relations Committee proudly hosted 2 Pet Tech Canine First Aid and CPR Courses for members and friends in May. Run by Cathy Hornyak, 14 topics were covered which included the use of life-size dog props. DOGS NSW will also be participating at the Sydney Dog Lovers Festival in August.

Scent Work: enjoys significant growth as trials reach capacity at exceptional speeds across all levels. In 2024 the Scent Work Working Party travelled Statewide hosting Scent Work workshops. Affiliated breed clubs are permitted to open their trials and events, other than Championship Shows, to any Groups and/or breeds at their discretion.

This removes the restriction of accepting entries for all sporting activities and trials by breed clubs. The Board of Directors gave dispensation to a breed club to hold an event with more than simply their own breed in an effort to increase the opportunity of members to enter - and it was a huge success!

It is a known fact that some sporting activities are reaching entry capacity and closing within hours due to the interest from members.

Rationale submitted for that dispensation was "For breed clubs to continue to exist, the events they hold must have to be financially viable".

It is more imperative that we assist not only our Affiliates, but these new sports activities to become a major part of our canine calendar.

### 1 STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report covers Royal NSW Canine Council Ltd (ABN 69 062 986 118) as a parent company, and Kennel Control of NSW Pty Ltd as a wholly owned subsidiary. The Royal NSW Canine Council Ltd is a company limited by guarantee, incorporated and domiciled in Australia.

### **Basis of Preparation**

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards - Simplified Disclosure Requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board (AASB) and the Corporations Act 2001. The company is a not-for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards.

Australian Accounting Standards set out accounting policies that the AASB has concluded would result in a financial report containing relevant and reliable information about transactions, events and conditions to which they apply. Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of this financial report are presented below. They have been consistently applied unless otherwise stated.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets. The amount presented in the financial statements have been rounded to the nearest dollar.

### **Accounting Policies**

### (a) Principles of Consolidation

A controlled entity is any entity the Royal NSW Canine Council Ltd has the power to control the financial and operating policies so as to obtain benefits from its activities. Details of the controlled entity are contained in Note 18.

All inter-company balances and transactions between parent and subsidiary, including any unrealised profits or losses, have been eliminated on consolidation.

### (b) Revenue

### **Revenue Recognition:**

The company has applied AASB 15: Revenue from Contracts with Customers (AASB 15) and AASB 1058: Income of Not-for-Profit Entities (AASB 1058).

### (i) Operating Grants and Sponsorship:

When the company receives operating grant revenue and sponsorship it assesses whether the contract is enforceable and has sufficiently specific performance obligations in accordance with AASB 15.

### (b) Revenue (cont'd)

### (i) Operating Grants and Sponsorship (cont'd):

When both these conditions are satisfied, the company - identifies each performance obligation relating to the grant - recognises a contract liability for its obligations under the agreement - recognises revenue as it satisfies its performance obligations.

### (ii) Capital Grants:

When the company receives a capital grant, it recognises a liability for the excess of the initial carrying amount of the financial asset received over any related amounts (being contributions by owners, lease liability, financial instruments, provisions, revenue or contract liability arising from a contract with a customer) recognised under other Australian Accounting Standards.

The company recognises income in profit or loss when or as the company satisfies its obligations under the terms of the grant.

If conditions are attached to the grant which must be satisfied before it is eligible to receive the contribution, the recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

### (iii) Membership Subscriptions:

For membership subscription arrangements that meet the criteria to be contracts with customers, revenue is recognised when the promised goods or services transfer to the customer as a member of the company.

If there is only one distinct membership service promised in the arrangement, the company recognises revenue as the membership service is provided, which is typically based on the passage of time over the subscription period to reflect the company's promise to stand ready to provide assistance and support to the member as required.

- (iv) Donations and bequests are recognised as revenue when received unless they are designated for a specific purpose, where they are carried forward as a liability on the statement of financial position.
- (v) Interest revenue is recognised on a time proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial asset.
- (vi) Revenue from the rendering of a service is recognised upon the delivery of the service to members and customers in accordance with relevant performance obligations.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

#### (c) Collectables

Collectables which include artwork owned by the company is carried at valuation. The independent valuation was performed by Peter Marejka of Lawsons Auctioneers on 6 May 2020.

#### (d) Inventories

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and current replacement cost.

#### (e) Leases

## The Company as lessee

At inception of a contract, the company assesses if the contract contains or is a lease. If there is a lease present, a right-of-use asset and a corresponding lease liability is recognised by the company where the company is a lessee. However all contracts that are classified as short-term leases (lease with remaining lease term of 12 months or less) and leases of low value assets are recognised as an operating expense on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease.

### **Concessionary Leases**

For leases that have significantly below-market terms and conditions principally to enable the company to further its objectives (commonly known as peppercorn/concessionary leases), the company has adopted the temporary relief under AASB 2019-8 and measures the right of use assets at cost on initial recognition.

## The Company as lessor

The company leases some rooms in their building to external parties.

Upon entering into each contract as a lessor, the company assesses if the lease is a finance or operating lease.

The contract is classified as a finance lease when the terms of the lease transfer substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership to the lessee. All other leases not within this definition are classified as operating leases.

Rental income received from operating leases is recognised on a straight-line basis over the term of the specific lease.

## (f) Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the company is non assessable for tax under the provisions of the Income Tax Assessment Act.

## (g) Goods and Service Tax

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. On these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of expense. Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of the GST.

## (h) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand and deposits held at call which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

#### (i) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the company's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits expected to be settled within one year together with entitlements arising from wages and salaries, annual leave and sick leave which will be settled after one year, have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled. Other employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured by reference to periods of service and current salary rates as it is considered that this results in an amount not materially different to that achieved by discounting estimated future cash flows.

The company's obligations for long-term employee benefits are presented as noncurrent liabilities in its statement of financial position, except where the company does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement for at least 12 months after the end of the reporting period, in which case the obligations are presented as current liabilities.

Contributions are made by the economic entity to any employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

## (j) Intangibles

#### **Software**

Software is recorded at cost. Software has a finite life and is carried at cost less any accumulated amortisation and impairment losses.

#### **Trade Mark**

Trade Mark registration is recorded at cost less any accumulated amortisation and impairment losses.

## (k) Property, Plant & Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value, less where applicable, any accumulated depreciation or amortisation and impairment loss.

## (l) Plant and Equipment and Leasehold Improvements

Plant and equipment and leasehold Improvements are measured on the cost basis less depreciation and impairment losses.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment and leasehold improvements are reviewed annually by the directors to ensure that they are not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets.

#### (m) Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives to the entity commencing from the time that the asset is held ready for use.

Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

## (o) Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgements

The directors evaluate estimates and judgements incorporated into the financial statements based on historical knowledge and best available current information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the group.

#### (i) Collectables

Collectables were independently valued on 6 May 2020.

#### (iii) Performance Obligations under AASB 15

To identify a performance obligation under AASB 15, the promise must be sufficiently specific to be able to determine when the obligation is satisfied. Management exercises judgement to determine whether the promise is sufficiently specific by taking into account any conditions specified in the arrangement, explicit or implicit, regarding the promised goods or services. In making this assessment, management includes the nature/type, cost/value, quantity and the period of transfer related to the goods or services promised.

## (p) Leases

At inception of a contract, the company assesses if the contract contains or is a lease. If there is a lease present, a right-of-use asset and a corresponding lease liability is recognised by the company where the company is a lessee. However all contracts that are classified as short-term leases (lease with remaining lease term of 12 months or less) and leases of low value assets are recognised as an operating expense on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease.

As disclosed in Note 19 the company's lease over its premises is being renegotiated and is expected to be finalised in the financial year commencing 1 July 2022.

#### Revenue - AASB 15/AASB 1058

The company has applied AASB 15 - Revenue from Contracts with customers and AASB 1058 - Income of Not-for-Profit Entities. Revenue from memberships is recognised as the membership service is provided which is based on the passage of time over the subscription period.

## (q) Financial Instruments

When determining whether the credit risk of a financial assets has increased significant since initial recognition and when estimating ECL, the Council's considers reasonable and supportable information that is relevant and available without undue cost or effort. This includes both quantitative and qualitative information and analysis based on the Council's historical experience and informed credit assessment and including forward looking information.

The Council's uses the presumption that an asset which is more than 30 days past due has seen a significant increase in credit risk.

The Council's uses the presumption that a financial asset is in default when:

- the other party is unlikely to pay its credit obligations to the Council's in full, without recourse to the Council's actions such as realising security (if any is held); or
- the financial asset is more than 90 days past due.

Credit losses are measured as the present value of the difference between the cash flows due to the Council in accordance with the contract and the cash flows expected to be received. This is applied using a probability weighted approach.

#### **Trade Receivables**

Impairment of trade receivables have been determined using the simplified approach in AASB 9 which uses an estimation of lifetime expected credit losses. The council has determined the probability of non-payment of the receivable and multiplied this by the amount of the expected loss arising from default.

The amount of the impairment is recorded in a separate allowance account with the loss being recognised in finance expense. Once the receivable is determined to be uncollectable then the gross carrying amount is written off against the associated allowance.

Where the council renegotiates the terms of trade receivables due from certain customers, the new expected cash flows are discounted at the original effective interest rate and any resulting difference to the carrying value is recognised in profit or loss.

#### Other financial assets measured at amortised cost

Impairment of other financial assets measured at amortised cost are determined using the expected credit loss model in AASB9. On initial recognition of the asset, an estimate of the expected credit losses for the next 12 months in recognised. Where the asset has experienced significant increase in credit risk then the lifetime losses are estimated and recognised.
