As Australia celebrates the nominees and winners for the 2026 Australian of the Year, <u>Puppy Tales</u> is once again proud to launch the search for the <u>2026 Australian Dog of the Year!</u>

Now in its sixth year, the **Puppy Tales Australian Dog of the Year** awards aim to sniff out the doggo who best embodies the true-blue Aussie spirit of love, courage, inspiration, assistance and fur-iendship. The winners will be unleashed on Australia Day, 26 January 2026.

"The 2025 Australian Dog of the Year, Elle, is a remarkable deaf rescue dog who communicates through sign language and supports school children facing anxiety and behavioural challenges, spreading joy wherever she goes. Elle is even part of the school staff photo, a testament to the incredible difference she's made in her community."



The nominations have been so doggone impressive that Puppy Tales has added fresh new awards to keep up, including the Canine Home Hero Medal and Dog of Talent Medal.

Also, this year's awards feature a special **new judging panel**, including ABC's *Muster Dogs* TV star Frank Fingers, 2025 Winner Elle's human, Robyn Adair and Agnes Beugnon, publisher of Australian Dog Lover.
